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## **Background - Misinformation**



- Misinformation is a "claim of fact that is currently false due to lack of scientific evidence". (Kouzy et al. 2020)
  - Conspiracy theories are a subset of misinformation
- People who believe conspiracy theories are often
  - Quite intelligent, but lack scientific sophistication to spot poor logic (Uscinski & Parent 2014, Ståhl & van Prooijen 2018)
  - Usually lonely and isolated (Gorman & Gorman 2017)
  - Feel powerless by uncertainty (Whitson & Galinsky 2008, Douglas et al. 2019)
  - Need quick resolution to the unknown. (Marchlewska et al. 2018)
- Attempts to correct misperceptions will often have a "backfire effect", making a person believe in the conspiracy theory even more firmly. (Lord et al. 1979)

#### **Downstream analysis**


- Geospatial, temporal & sentiment analysis
- Unsupervised learning (Dynamic Topic Modeling)

#### Classification

- Label datasets
- Supervised machine learning

#### Keyword filtering

- Filter for 13 top myths identified by NewsGuard.
- Exploratory analysis
  - temporal analysis network analysis



### Focus on 4 specific conspiracy theories

1. "Origin story" — COVID is bioweapon, or engineered in a laboratory

2. **5g and COVID**— COVID is actually the result of radiation from 5g, either through direct transmission or immune system impact


3. Gates Foundation Created — The Gates foundation funded a company which holds a patent on the coronavirus & is using this pandemic for their own personal financial gain

4. Anti-vaccination/ Vaccine hesitancy — The intersection of anti-vaccination or vaccine hesitant rhetoric and COVID. Includes people talking about why they won't get a COVID vaccine, and some overlap with the Gates foundation conspiracy (re: microchipping people for depopulation purposes)



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



